Rothschild Boulevard Tel Aviv

One of the principal streets in the center of Tel Aviv, Israel , beginning in Neve Tzedek at its southwestern edge and running north to Habima Theatre . It is one of the most expensive streets in the city, Being one of the city's main tourist attractions. It features a wide, tree-lined central strip with pedestrian and bike lanes.

Israel's Declaration of Independence was signed at Independence Hall on Rothschild Boulevard. Many of the historic buildings are built in the Bauhaus or international style, forming part of the White City of Tel Aviv, a UNESCO-designated World Heritage Site.

Rothschild Boulevard is at the heart of Tel Aviv's financial district. It is where the First International Bank Tower is located, as well as the Israel offices of HSBC Bank. By 2005 the boulevard had undergone a dramatic transformation as historic buildings were restored and residents began flowing back in and injecting the street with a renewed cultural energy.



TLV Atmosphere

Tel Aviv is a major center of culture and entertainment .Eighteen of Israel's 35 major centers for the performing arts are located in the city, including five of the country's nine large theaters.

Tel Aviv is consistently ranked as one of the top LGBT destinations in the world With 2.5 million international visitors annually, Tel Aviv is the fifth-most-visited city in the Middle East & Africa. It is known as "the city that never sleeps" and a "party capital" due to its thriving nightlife, young atmosphere and famous 24-hours culture.

The beaches of Tel Aviv play a major role in the city's cultural and touristic scene.

Tel Aviv is an international hub of highly active and diverse nightlife with bars, dance bars and nightclubs staying open well past midnight. The largest area for nightclubs is the Tel Aviv port.

Tel Aviv is famous for its wide variety of world-class restaurants, offering traditional Israeli dishes as well as international fare.
